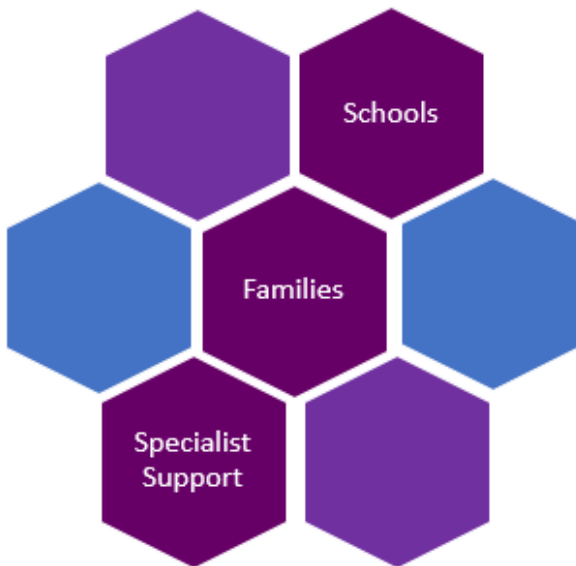

What is Domestic Abuse?

Domestic Abuse can include:

Physical - hitting, punching, strangling, pushing

Emotional - shouting, threats, blackmail, constant criticism, mind games

Sexual - any behaviours of sexual nature that are not consensual

Economic – controlling finances, preventing someone from working, taking out loans, benefit fraud, overspending and building up debt in victim's name

Harassment and stalking - unwanted contact and ongoing monitoring and surveillance

Digital abuse – unwanted social media messages, monitoring movement via an oyster card, revenge porn

Coercive and coercive behaviour – intimidation, threats, humiliation to harm, control, punish or frighten them

The government defines domestic abuse as between people who are aged 16 or over and are personally connected i.e. intimate partners or family members. Anyone can experience domestic abuse, regardless of their gender, age, ethnicity, status, sexuality or background.

Survivors of domestic abuse usually experience fear and shame. They may blame themselves for being abused, even if the only person responsible for domestic abuse is the person using it.



Impact of Domestic Abuse on Children

Children who see, hear, or experience the effects of domestic abuse are victims in their own right. The impact of domestic abuse on children is negative and can last into adulthood. Coercive and controlling behaviours between parents or carers are as harmful to the children as physical violence.

Some of the ways that a child could respond to domestic abuse include:

Emotional issues:

- Aggression
- Irritability
- Panic
- Regression
- Withdrawal
- Excessive crying
- Underachievement
- Self-blame and guilt



Physical symptoms:

- Problems sleeping
- Nightmares or flashbacks
- Tummy aches
- Bedwetting
- Eating disorders
- Headaches

Concerns at school:

- Low attainment levels
- Difficulty concentrating in lessons
- Increase absence
- Frequent lateness
- Unwillingness to attend school
- Poor peer relationships

Domestic abuse at home may make children believe that violence and fear are a normal part of everyday life and that they are not entitled to safety.



Operation Encompass

Operation Encompass is an early information sharing partnership between the police and schools.

The police share information with the schools' Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) the day after an incident of domestic abuse has been reported to the police which has impacted on the school's pupil(s).

The aim of this process is to ensure that the child is offered sensitivity and understanding following a distressing incident of domestic abuse

How does it work?

Your school will receive Operation Encompass notifications by email. The emails are sent in the mornings to the schools' DSL. The emails are password-protected and the DSL will have received a password unique to the school.

Your school may be able to reassure the child that you know about what's happened. This can be a relief for a child as it can give them permission to talk about how they feel and what's happening to them. You may be able to offer them support with homework or exams, provide an opportunity for counselling and link them in with a specialist practitioner from the Children Affected by Domestic Abuse Project.



Children Affected by Domestic Abuse (CADA) Project

The CADA Project offers therapeutic support for children and young people affected by domestic abuse and their non-abusive parents. It's a fixed term project running until the end of March 2022.

What support does CADA offer?

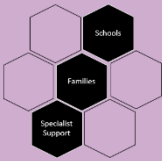
The project offers each school access to a designated Parent and Child Domestic Abuse Worker (PCDAWs). The PCDAWs are specialist in supporting children affected by domestic abuse, they're part of Hounslow's Domestic and Sexual Violence Outreach Service. The support provided is independent and available to all school-aged children in Hounslow, regardless whether they are receiving support from children's social care.

Support for children:

- Safety planning
- Emotional support
- Space to explore child's experience of hurting in the family
- Support to aid healing from domestic abuse
- Reassurance that domestic abuse was not the child's fault
- Emotional literacy
- Self esteem

Support for non-abusive parents:

- Safety planning
- Practical and emotional support
- Advocacy
- Space to learn about different ways of supporting the children with their recovery from domestic abuse
- Help to explore options and choices to make informed decisions
- Empowerment



CADA and Operation Encompass

The Parent and Child Domestic Abuse Workers receive all Operation Encompass notifications and can work with you to support pupils and parents who have experienced domestic abuse.

Early support for all children

It is likely that there will be children in your school who are living with domestic abuse but remain unknown to services and Operation Encompass.

The CADA Project can support these families too.

Making a referral to the CADA Project:

- Speak with the non-abusive parent about the service, request their consent for a referral to CADA and a safe contact number.
- Contact your designated Parent and Child Domestic Abuse Worker to discuss the family and share the safe contact information.

The Parent and Child Domestic Abuse Worker will then meet with the parent and child to assess their needs and arrange support sessions.

The assessment may highlight other therapeutic interventions suitable for the child and parent. These can include the Let's Talk Programme and therapy provided by Hounslow Youth Counselling Service or Phoenix Counselling Service.

What to do if you're concerned about a child?

If you are concerned about a child living with domestic abuse or receive a disclosure of domestic abuse from a child, please follow the safeguarding protocol for your school. You can also reach out to the non-abusive parent and speak to them about the CADA Project.

How to speak to a parent who's experiencing domestic abuse?

Most adults experiencing domestic abuse do want to be asked about it and are unlikely to be offended. Here are some tips on how to speak with parents about their experience of domestic abuse:

Speak with the parent in a safe way, ask if it's safer to speak on the phone or better to meet at school

Ask if they have any immediate safety concerns. Call 999 if there's an immediate risk of harm

Believe the parent, offer reassurance and remain non-judgemental in your approach

Speak to the parent about abuse away from the children

Do not ask the parent to separate from their partner

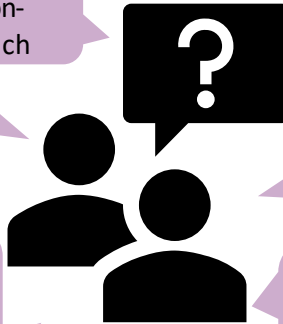
Consider how the school may respond if the perpetrator visits or contacts school

Consider transport arrangements if a child is in a temporary address to try to ensure the child maintains their school place

Be aware of child arrangement orders, injunctions, bail conditions, exclusion orders etc. especially if they include the school

Ask if the parent would like support from the CADA Project and make a referral

If the family reside in a refuge or temporary accommodation, keep the address confidential and record only the PO Box address of the refuge on file





CADA: Therapeutic Support and Counselling

Let's Talk Programme

Let's Talk is a free 12-week structured therapeutic group programme for children, young people and mothers affected by domestic violence. It was expanded with CADA funding but will continue after March 2020.

In the children and young people's group, the facilitators help children share their experiences in a safe, fun and confidential environment.

Programme activities include art, stories, discussion, role play and videos to enable children to express their feelings.

Topics covered in the sessions include feelings, anger, safety planning, children's experiences of violence, problem solving, staying safe from sexual abuse, dealing with family changes and self-esteem.

The mother's group offers a safe, supportive and confidential environment to help women to communicate with their children about their experiences, while building up their own support network with women who have had similar experiences.

Let's Talk is for families where the perpetrating adults no longer resides in the family home.

CADA: Therapeutic Support and Counselling

As part of the CADA project they offer free play therapy sessions for children under 11 affected by domestic abuse.

Cranstoun: Men and Masculinities Programme

The Men and Masculinities programme is for men who are aware that their relationships have become distressing and damaged by their behaviour.

The programme will create a safe and supportive space to help you explore what it means to be a man, a partner and a father. We will address the impact of conflict, anger, anxiety and addiction on your relationships and help you try to rebuild the trust you have lost.

The programme also offers a linked (ex-) partner support service upon referral.

What does the programme cover?

The programme focuses on behaviour, how we act, how this reinforces how we think and feel, and most importantly, how to act differently. It is also designed to support any other treatment you may be involved with.

The programme is a rolling programme that lasts up to 24 weeks across three core modules:

- Coercion
- Control
- Consequences

One Stop Shop

Parents who are experiencing domestic abuse can access comprehensive advice and support from the Hounslow One Stop Shop.

This is a weekly drop-in service which provides access to a variety support options for all victims of gender-based violence, including domestic and sexual violence, forced marriage, honour-based violence, female genital mutilation, prostitution, human trafficking for sexual exploitation and stalking.
