ECO-ALTERNATIVES

GLITTER

Fallen leaves can become natural 'glitter' using a hole punch.

Plant trees instead - they will last longer, can be free for schools and positively impact our planet.

Using your hole punch you can also recycle used, coloured paper into 'glitter' for crafts.

Host a group kite flight - it will look just as spectacular and is more interactive.

Forage in your school grounds, carefully pick tiny petals to replace glitter in crafts.

Plan a group walk 'n' talk in your local community - great for pupils reflecting on their time spent together.

Another natural alternative is lentils they're cheap and come in brown, yellow, green, red and black varieties. Perform a group drum-a-long using recycled materials. Allow the beat to bring people together.

Coloured sand is easy to make using liquid food dye and sand.

Create bee and wildflower balls, to 'release' into your local community.

Rice can also be dyed using food colouring and vinegar for sensory play.

Organise an applause - this might be in remembrance or celebration.
