WHOLE-SCHOOL STRATEGIES FOR SUPPORTING CHILDREN DISPLAYING CHALLENGING BEHAVIOUR (CROSS-PHASE)

The aim of the session:

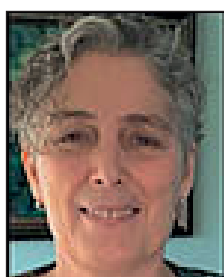
- ▶ Focusing on understanding students triggers and cues to develop strategies to manage crisis situations.
- ▶ Identifying that every student has unique strengths and talents that can be utilised to develop support plans that help them when they show signs of distress.
- ▶ Developing positive interventions when behaviour that 'challenges' us occurs.
- ▶ Being reflective and continually evaluating the support strategies used.
- ▶ Understanding that relationships are key and are paramount to all human interactions. We are all far more likely to listen and respond appropriately to someone we have a positive relationship with.
- ▶ Having effective relationships with students help us: Model and encourage positive behaviour; Teach students new skills to communicate need / feelings; Adopt a proactive approach to supporting students based on attachment, nurture, respect, fairness, consistency and care.

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The session will be led by Helen Tyzack, Head of the Bridge Primary Centre in Hounslow. Helen has worked in Hounslow since 2000 and has extensive experience in supporting pupils at risk of exclusion from mainstream provision. She has worked as both a Pupil Support Officer and a teacher as well as managing a team of outreach workers.

In 2007 following a review of, “Emotional and Behavioural Difficulties” in the borough, Woodbridge Park Education Service was set up. This service offers a range of support for pupils with Social, Emotional and Mental Health needs, including outreach support, offsite intervention and provision for children and young people who have been permanently excluded.

In addition to her role as Head of the Bridge, Helen is also Deputy Head and Trauma Informed Champion for this Service and the lead for Behaviour and Attendance.
