Charlotte Raby

Charlotte is a trained primary school teacher, consultant and ITE lecturer specialising in English and an Open University Reading for Pleasure HEI partnership member. She is also an inaugural member of the English Hubs Council and continues to give advice to the DfE.

Zoe Antoniades

Zoe Antoniades was born in West London of Greek Cypriot parents. She is an English and Drama graduate of the University of Hull and a trained teacher. Zoe has taught in Lambeth and Hounslow working on a wide range of creative projects in partnership with the Southbank Centre, the Royal Albert Hall, the Young Vic and Polka Theatre, Music for Youth and Film Club. Zoe also works as a creative writing workshop leader providing interactive classes and author talks.

Now signed with Andersen Press, Zoe has been working on a brand new series about twins, Cally & Jimmy. There are currently three books in the series and have proved very popular with KS1 and LKS2 readers.



Josh Lacey

Josh Lacey is a London-born children's author. He has written about 30 books; his first published work was A Dog Called Grk. This series of eight books has been translated into 12 languages. He is also the writer of the popular Dragonsitter series for 6-9 year olds. Josh's most recent series is about Hope Jones, a 10 year girl who is very worried about climate change. Hope Jones Saves the World is the first book in the series and was shortlisted for the Little Rebels Award in 2021. In 2022, he published his first picture book – The Pet Potato

As a local author based in West London, Josh enjoys visiting schools to talk about his work.



Lucy Noguera

Lucy Noguera is a children's author, she lives in Ealing, London with her family. She was a primary school teacher and then a teacher of the deaf before starting her own small educational company. She has worked with many schools arranging and planning book-based events and projects, all with the aim of encouraging children to develop a lifelong love of reading.

Her first chapter book – Swop The Satsuma-Sized Secret is a 7+ chapter book, designed to be very accessible. It's dyslexic-friendly both in layout and font. It has illustrations throughout and is the first in a new series, the second one Swop The Daring Dinosaur Detective is due this year.

Her first picture book, Herman Needs A Home, is an adventure story underpinned by themes of conservation and the effects of plastic pollution on marine wildlife and beaches.
